

Cleaning and Care

For the first 30 Days:

Treat your cabinetry gently. The catalyzed finish is still curing.

Cleaning your Cabinetry or Bath Furniture:

Dust often. Use a clean, soft cloth and wipe with the grain to remove loose foreign particles from the finish surface. If desired, moisten the cloth with a few drops of water.

Clean occasionally (or as needed) with a damp cloth. Dampen with warm water to remove dirt or spills. Add a little dish soap to the water if needed. For stubborn grime, consider Guardsman Kitchen Cabinet Cleaner.

Polish with caution or don't polish at all. Catalyzed finish requires no polish. If you choose to polish your cabinetry, look for polish with **no silicone**. Silicone damages your cabinet's finish. Guardsman Kitchen Cabinet Polish is safe on your cabinet's finish.

The Natural Beauty of Wood.

Variation in grain and color creates the beauty of real hardwood. Quality wood finishes highlight the unusual graining and color patterns. After hardwoods are finished they are affected by exposure to sunlight and the elements. That's why new cabinets will never be the same color as an aged sample or bathroom display. Some people find natural variety distasteful, but most welcome it as the reason they chose real wood instead of an imitation wood grain or plastic.

Light stains show the color variations most clearly—but the color will change. Wood "mellows" as it ages, often darkening significantly as it expands and contracts over the course of a year. Some species of wood darken more than others. Opaque (or painted) finishes keep their color, but hairline cracks appear at the joints of the cabinet frame, doors and drawer fronts. When the wood contracts, the seams become more visible, gaining a distinctive characteristic of antique painted cabinetry. Despite the hairline cracks, the joint itself remains strong and solid.

Cherry: A traditional favorite that finishes to a glass-like smoothness—mostly! Cherry contains "gum lines." In the living tree, they carried nutrients through the wood. After finish, they look like irregular black streaks or pits that run along the grain, imbuing each cabinet with unique character. Gum lines provide physical texture to dark finishes. Color in cherry wood offers colors from nearly white to a deep mahogany red, depending on the individual tree. Expect cherry to mellow as it ages, with the color becoming richer and deeper.

Cherry Rustic: Cherry Rustic has all of the qualities listed above for Cherry. Expect the rustic character of larger knots, open knots, gum lines, pitch pockets, pits, surface splits, dark mineral streaks and worm holes to appear unpredictably throughout to emphasize the natural beauty of the wood. When a Glaze is applied expect these rustic qualities to become much more pronounced.

Maple. Favored for its strong, closed grain and warm color. Cream white, light brown and deep reddish brown heartwood allow maple to show off the lines of your cabinetry. Dark streaks of black, brown and burnt umber often accent the lighter colors. Occasionally, the grain calls attention to itself with a wavy pattern that is known as flame maple or curly maple. Makers of fine guitars and violins seek out the curly-grained pattern because it's even stronger than straight-grained maple.

Red Oak. The stalwart tree of early America displays the most interesting grain patterns of our wood species. Luminous rays complement the open grain, running with and sometimes across it. The interplay between grain and ray combines with sawing technique to produce abundantly textured wood. Soft shades of pink, tan and white with occasional touches of green, brown and black form the Red Oak palette, creating furniture that adds quiet strength to your home.

Limited Lifetime Product Warranty

This is the nature of the hardwood species and unusual graining or color variations are natural and acceptable condition of quality wood finishes. As opaque finishes age they will show cracking at frame, door and drawer front joints. All finishes may darken over time. All of these characteristics are natural wood characteristics and are not covered under this warranty.
